Public Policy

Actively participated and listened at community forums for Boston Public Schools' initiatives. Created proposals as a parent activist including:

- Build BPS, 2018 - created a structure for grade configurations that would allow K-6 and K-8 schools to equally thrive in the district. Suggested priorities for the process and addressed equity issues.
- BPS Budget, provided suggestions for saving money, finding new revenue sources, and changing priorities to focus more on equity. Also pushed for more funding of social emotional supports with the Boston School Committee, and the Boston City Council.
- School Start Times, 2017 and 2018 - created an initial proposal for the Transportation Challenge (a contest to generate ideas to save money on transportation at BPS), and then created additional proposals in response to parent feedback.
- School Assignment, 2013 - created three proposals. Had an impact on moving the district away from a zone based model and to a home based model (one of my proposals was home based and offered equal access to quality schools). In 2018 wrote about increasing equity by reforms to the current system.

Disability Rights

- Requested quicker posts of transcripts from Boston City Council meetings for better accessibility for residents with hearing challenges in 2018.
- Promote inclusion for students in schools and in extracurriculars
- Push for removing florescent lights, offering quiet hand dryers and toilets without automatic flush in public bathrooms and in Boston Public School bathrooms, for those with sensory sensitivities.
- Promote "Autism Acceptance Month" instead of "Autism Awareness Month" in city government and in the Boston Public Schools
- Contributed to "Outside the Lines" meetings (for parents of students with special needs) at my daughters' school and created a list of resources for families.
- Participated in the Online Disability March as part of the Women's March with my daughter.
